Location

The Queensland Cricketers' Club is located only 3 kilometres from the CBD, via the South East Freeway & taking the Vulture Street exit. Club entrance and reception is via the ramp walkway from Vulture Street (opposite the German Club).

The Club has a unique and special location on Level 3 of the Northern Stand overlooking the famous 'Gabba' International Cricket Ground.

Dress Regulations

Street parking is available in Vulture Street and surrounding areas. However, a 2-hour limit applies to 'on-street' parking on week-days.
